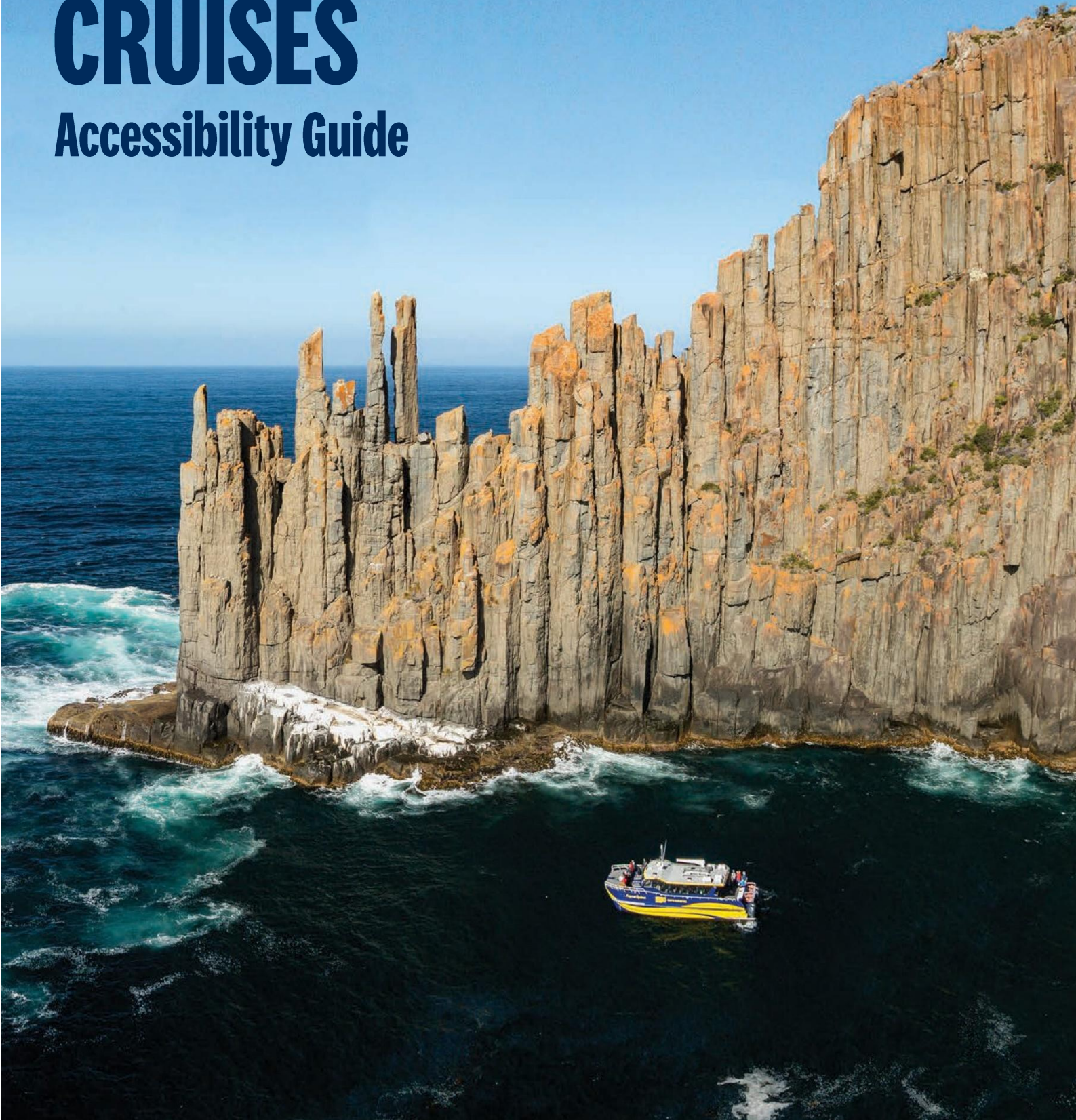

Key Tour Information

- 90-minute cruise aboard catamaran vessel. Vessel is enclosed on three sides, with space for two wheelchairs. Ensure you have warm clothing, as it does cool down on the water.
- Highlights: Explore the spectacular Cape Raoul coastline from the Port Arthur Historic Site. Join in the search for the abundant coastal wildlife such as seals, dolphins, migrating whales and sea birds.
- Tours start and finish at the Port Arthur Historic Site – 6973 Arthur Highway, Port Arthur.
- Port Arthur Historic Site entry is required to join the tour. The Port Arthur Historic Site is fully accessible, with level access from disabled car park spaces through booking centre / café, along with buggy transport available to cruise departure point.
- Option to join a bus transfer from Hobart.
- **Right:** There is a 70 cm wide walkway with handrails that wraps around the vessel.



Vessel Location and Boarding

- It's important to be checked in and ready to go 15 minutes prior to cruise departure at the Port Arthur Historic Site jetty – 300m from the visitor centre.
- There is ramped access available from visitor centre all the way through to the vessel.
- Once boarding, you will be on the vessel for the duration of the 90-minute cruise.
- Ensure you wait for the blue boat pictured above, the white boat is a different tour.
- **Below left:** map excerpt showing path to the jetty (26) from visitor centre.
- **Below right:** picture of jetty building, crew will meet you in here for boarding.



Vessel Information and Seating

- The vessel has a total of 45 seats and space for two wheelchairs.
- The seating is laid out in a 3-3 configuration.
- **Right:** image showing wheelchair space.
- **Below:** image showing seating dimensions. 88cm pitch, 48cm width, 38cm legroom.



Access Dimensions

- **Top left:** The ramp to the vessel from the jetty building is 1.8 metres wide with handrails both sides.
- **Top right:** The ramp from jetty onto the vessel is 90 centimetres wide, and 2.5 metres long.
- **Below:** Image showing area at back of boat, immediately behind wheelchair area.



- **Below:** image of bow area on boat. Handrails around 70 cm wide external walkway, or 70 cm wide door from cabin.



Toilet Facilities

- There is a toilet on the vessel but it is not wheelchair accessible.
- There is an accessible toilet located at the Port Arthur visitor centre, and in the jetty building prior to departure. Guests are advised to use these facilities prior to boarding.
- The marine toilet on the vessel is located below deck level. There is a 15cm combing (step), then 4 steps down at 22 cm each. Door entry width is 56 cm.
- **Right:** Image showing access down to toilet.
